RESOLUTION NO 42 OF 2019

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING APRIL 2019 AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH IN THE CITY OF SHREVEPORT, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

BY: COUNCILMAN GRAYSON BOUCHER

WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every community member of Shreveport-Bossier City; and

WHEREAS, rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment impact our community, and statistics show one in five women, and one in seventy-one men will be raped at some point in their lives; and

WHEREAS, child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in five girls and one in twenty boys will experience a sexual assault before age 18; and

WHEREAS, on college campuses, one in five women and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted during their time in college; and

WHEREAS, the theme of this year's Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign is "I Ask." The campaign champions the power of asking for consent – whether it be asking to hold someone's hand, for permission to share personal information with others, or if a partner is interested in sex. Consent is a clear, concrete example of what it takes to end sexual harassment, abuse, and assault. The goal of the campaign is to empower everyone to put consent into practice. "I Ask" is the statement by which individuals will demonstrate that asking for consent is a healthy, normal, and necessary part of everyday interactions; and

WHEREAS, April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month, and each day of the year is an opportunity to believe survivors, and create change for the future.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport in due regular and legal session convened that the Shreveport City Council designates and proclaims April 2019, as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in the City of Shreveport. We join Project Celebration, and advocates in communities across the country in taking action to prevent sexual violence.

1. Glenda Dennie Baxter has agreed to secure all permits and inspections required by the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, Comprehensive Building Code and Department of Engineering.
2. Glenda Dennie Baxter is hereby authorized to connect the structure located at 9451 Linwood Avenue to the City of Shreveport's water and/or sewer system.
3. In accordance with Shreveport City Code Section 94-5, the property owner of premises served by water services shall be responsible for the house line to the premises. The property owner of premises served by sewer services shall be responsible for the lateral line from the premises to the sewer main.
4. In accordance with Shreveport City Code Section 94-7, if the annexation request is withdrawn, the facility shall be disconnected from City water or sewerage service.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING PORTIONS OF SECTION 1 OF THE SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA, CITY COUNCIL RULES OF PROCEDURE, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Shreveport City Charter Section 4.13 the Shreveport City Council shall adopt rules defining the duties of the chairman, vice chairman and the clerk of council, and governing its employees, organization of any of its committees, the time, place and procedure of its meetings, including the procedure provided for in Section 4.30, and the transaction of its business; and

WHEREAS, said rules of procedure have been adopted and are codified in the City's online publications as Appendix "A" - City Council Rules of Procedure (to the Code of Ordinances, City of Shreveport, Louisiana); and

RESOLUTION NO. 39 OF 2019

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SHREVEPORT AND PLANET AQUA GROUP FOUNDATION, RELATIVE TO AFFIXING PERMANENT STORM DRAIN MARKERS ON DESIGNATED STORM DRAINS DURING AN OCEAN DAY EVENT IN DOWNTOWN SHREVEPORT, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, Article VII, Section 14(C), provides that, “[f]or a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions or political corporations may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private association, corporation, or individual;” and

WHEREAS, the CITY is the owner of various storm drains in Shreveport, Louisiana; and
WHEREAS, PLANET AQUA GROUP is desirous of hosting an Ocean Day event on June 8, 2019 to place permanent storm drain markers (“Markers”) on designated CITY storm drains to make the public aware of the environmental consequences of littering and dumping into the storm drains; and

WHEREAS, this one day event will provide an opportunity for citizens of the City of Shreveport and surrounding areas to come together to raise awareness that what goes into the storm drains ends up in the ocean; and

WHEREAS, this event provides a benefit to the public and serves a public purpose.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, in due, regular and legal session convened, that: The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the City of Shreveport and Planet Aqua Group Foundation, substantially in accordance with the draft of said agreement attached hereto as Exhibit “A”, which was filed for public inspection with the original of this Resolution in the Office of the Clerk of Council.

RESOLUTION NO. 44 OF 2019

A RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION OF ALL PROPOSED LEGISLATION THAT TRANSFERS THE ADMINISTRATION AND COLLECTION OF LOCAL SALES & USE TAXES TO THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE.

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Louisiana grants local governments the right to levy and collect local sales and use taxes;

WHEREAS, there are several constitutional amendments and bills introduced in the 2019 Regular Legislative Session that would transfer collection responsibility of local sales and use tax levies to the state Department of Revenue; and

WHEREAS, local taxing authorities possess the best knowledge and experience to properly collect its own taxes and have a proven record of proactive advancements in the areas of enforcement, audit coverage, dispute resolution, reporting technology and successful litigation; and

WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana's budget issues do not offer prospects for the Department of Revenue to have sufficient resources to provide the necessary taxpayer assistance, enforcement programs and training of its employees on the specific application of local sales and use tax ordinances without significant cost contributions from local governments, thereby resulting in the direct and indirect loss of local tax receipts; and

WHEREAS, many local taxing authorities have issued bonded indebtedness guaranteed by the passage locally adopted sales and use tax levies, collection of said levies the direct responsibility of local governments, and which transfer of that responsibility to a state agency may generate legal challenges and jeopardize future bond issues; and

WHEREAS, the central local collector in each parish is directly responsible to the local taxing authorities and their elected officials for the performance of local tax administration, and the Secretary Revenue being an appointee of the Governor of the state, uncertainty exist as to who in the Department of Revenue will be accountable to local taxing authorities for the performance of such critical local tax administration,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, that each member of the legislative delegation for the Parish of Caddo is urged to vigorously oppose any and all proposed legislation that transfers the administration and collection of local sales and use taxes to the Louisiana Department of Revenue; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent forthwith to said legislators so that they will be made aware of our position on this matter
