ORDINANCE NO. 44 OF 2020

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO SUSPEND ARTICLE 8, SECTION 8.10 OF THE CITY OF SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA, UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE USE OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES DURING THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

BY COUNCILMAN: JOHN NICKELSON

WHEREAS, the City of Shreveport has the authority to preserve public peace, safety, morals, health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Shreveport City Charter, Section 2.04(a) and (c) the City of Shreveport has the authority to “enact and enforce all necessary ordinances and regulations pertaining to public peace, safety, morals, health and welfare” and “take all actions necessary, requisite and proper to protect life and property in the event of an emergency”; and

WHEREAS, Governor John Bel Edwards declared a Public Health Emergency in response to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Shreveport to preserve the public peace, safety, morals, health and welfare and take all actions necessary, requisite and proper to protect life during this COVID-19 Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS, medical personnel working in close contact with COVID-19 across the country are taking measures to protect the lives of themselves, their families and others during this COVID-19 Public Health Emergency; including living and sleeping separately from those they share a home with; and

WHEREAS, temporarily living in recreational vehicles is one way in which medical personnel working in close contact with COVID-19 can protect the lives of their families and others while remaining close to home; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Shreveport City Charter, Section 4.19, due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, the City Council has determined it is necessary to enact this Emergency Ordinance to suspend the provisions of Article 8, Section 8.10 of the City of Page 2 of 2 Shreveport, Louisiana, Unified Development Code to allow medical personnel to live and sleep in recreation vehicles, and that the recreational vehicles be allowed in residential driveways and be connected to City utilities for this

purpose in order to preserve public peace, safety, morals, health and welfare and to protect life during this COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Article 8, Section 8.10 of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, Unified Development Code is hereby suspended for medical personnel utilizing recreational vehicles to keep themselves, their families, and others safe due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency. This suspension of Article 8, Section 8.10 is necessary in order to preserve public peace, safety, morals, health and welfare and to protect life during this COVID-19 Public Health Emergency. This suspension shall continue for the duration of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency declaration in the State of Louisiana or through December 31, 2020, whichever comes first.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this is an emergency ordinance in accordance with Shreveport City Charter, Section 4.19 in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision or item of this Emergency Ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications of this Emergency Ordinance which can be given affect without the invalid provisions, items or applications and to this end the provisions of this Emergency Ordinance are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Emergency Ordinance shall become effective immediately in accordance with the provisions of Shreveport City Charter Section 4.19.

A PROCLAMATION (RESOLUTION) ORDERING AND CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD TO FILL THE VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF COUNCIL, DISTRICT A, CITY OF SHREVEPORT, FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM THEREOF; TO SET THE DATES THERE FOR AND OTHER PERTINENT MATTERS; AND OTHERWISE PROVIDING WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, the Honorable Willie Bradford served the Shreveport City Council, District A and the City of Shreveport with distinction; and

WHEREAS, Councilman Bradford's resignation, effective April 30, 2020, created a vacancy in the Office of Shreveport City Council, District A; and

WHEREAS, the unexpired term of said office exceeds eighteen (18) months; and

WHEREAS, City Council District A is wholly located within the boundaries of the City of Shreveport; and

WHEREAS, the City Council as the governing authority of the City of Shreveport is therefore required to call an election to fill the unexpired term of said office by La. R.S. 18:602.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport, acting in due, regular, and legal session convened, as follows:

Section 1. That, as required by and pursuant to law, an election shall be and the same is hereby called to elect a successor to the office of City Council District A, City of Shreveport, to serve the unexpired term of said vacant office.

Section 2. That, in accordance with La. R.S. 18:602 and 18:402, the primary election to elect a successor to the unexpired term shall be held on November 3, 2020 and the general election, should it be necessary, shall be held on December 5, 2020; both elections to be held within the boundaries of District A, City of Shreveport, State of Louisiana, in compliance with the provisions of the Louisiana Election Code.

Section 3. That the Clerk of Council shall publish this proclamation immediately in the official journal of the City of Shreveport, Caddo Parish, and Bossier Parish in accordance with La. R.S. 18:602.

Section 4. That the polling place Commissioners and the polling places for this election shall be the same as those designated within City Council District A, City of Shreveport, for the primary election on November 3, 2020 and the general election on December 5, 2020 to elect other public officials in accordance with the provisions of the Louisiana Election Code.

Section 5. That the qualifying period for the primary election shall open on July 15, 2020 and shall close on July 17, 2020.

Section 6. That the Clerk of Council be and is hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to execute and furnish any certification, form, proclamation, or ancillary requirement for the proper holding of said election.

Section 7. That the Clerk of Council shall forward certified copies of this Resolution by certified mail within twenty-four (24) hours to the Louisiana Secretary of State, Bossier Parish Clerk of Court, and Caddo Parish Clerk of Court in accordance with La. R.S. 18:602.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any provision or item of this Resolution or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications and to this end, the provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared severable.

WHEREAS, the City Council as the governing authority must fill the vacancy in accordance with LA. R.S. 18:602.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport, acting in due, regular, and legal session convened, that the voting procedure to fill the Shreveport City Council,

District A vacancy shall be as follows:

1. The name of each present Councilmember shall be called.
2. Each Councilmember shall state the name of the candidate they desire to fill the District A vacancy as their vote.
3. The candidate to receive a majority vote from Councilmembers present and voting shall be appointed to fill the Shreveport City Council, District A vacancy.
4. If no candidate receives a majority vote once all present and voting Councilmembers have cast their vote, there shall be a second round of voting to only include the two (2) candidates that received the highest number of votes. If there is a tie of more than two (2) candidates receiving the highest number of votes, all tied candidates shall move to the second round of voting. This process shall continue until a qualified candidate receives a majority vote or until the City Council determines it is unable to come to a decision.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any provision or item of this Resolution or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications and to this end, the provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared severable.

SECTION I: BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport, Caddo Parish, LA, in due, legal and regular session convened, that the zoning classification of property located approximately one hundred and twenty feet northwest of the Interstate 220 overpass at Hilry Huckaby III Avenue, Shreveport, Caddo Parish, Louisiana, legally described below: be and the same is hereby changed from NA, Natural Areas District, to I-2, Heavy Industrial District: 14.527 ACS. M/L - LOT 1, LAKE PLAZA SUBDIVISION, UNIT NO. 2, Section 29, T18N, R14W, Caddo Parish, Louisiana. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision or item of this ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items, or applications and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
