## Three jailed in shooting critically injuring teen

Three men are now behind bars relative to their alleged involvement in a shooting which sent a teenage girl to the hospital Saturday evening.

Shortly after 6:00 p.m. on February 1, 2020, Shreveport Police patrol officers responded to the 3100 block of Hollywood Avenue relative to reports of shots fired. Upon officer's arrival, they located numerous shell casings littering the parking lot of a gas station. Moments later, authorities learned a 15 year old girl, suffering a gunshot wound to the head, had arrived at a local hospital. It was further discovered the shooting victim had been shot while sitting inside a car parked at the gas station when shots rang out. The victim, was subsequently driven to the hospital by private transport.

Based on information and evidence gathered at the scene of the crime, it is believed a verbal altercation between two groups of men ensued on the parking lot of the gas station, leading to the involved parties producing guns and exchanging rounds. All alleged shooters fled following the incident. Shreveport Police Violent Crimes detectives were called to the scene, along with Crime Scene investigators. Detectives worked tirelessly throughout the evening in search of the whereabouts of those involved parties. As a result, authorities were able to link three local men to the shooting. Upon apprehending the suspects, investigators conducted interviews relative to their involvement in the crime. Following interviews, detectives arrested 20 year old Tyrese Graham (Attempted Manslaughter), 22 year old Ladarius Casey (Illegal Discharge of a Firearm) and 28 year old Tristan Dallas (Accessory after the fact to Attempted Murder). All three men were booked into the Shreveport City Jail. The shooting victims remains hospitalized.
